# National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2015

NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) commenced in Australian schools in 2008. Each year, all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in common national tests which assess:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy.

The scheduled dates for the tests in 2015 are Tuesday 12 May, Wednesday 13 May and Thursday 14 May.

The benefits of participating in NAPLAN testing:

- NAPLAN tests the skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy.
- NAPLAN results provide valuable information on how your child is progressing against national minimum standards of literacy and numeracy skills expected for each year level.
- The NAPLAN tests provide you as parents with an individual report that shows your child's results and a comparison of your child's performance against all other Australian students in their year level.
- Teachers use the NAPLAN results to determine your child's areas of strength and where future focus
  is required and how best to provide support or extension activities.
- School teachers use the online NAPLAN Toolkit to analyse your child's results. The Toolkit provides
  detailed information right down to the individual question with links to teaching strategies.
- Principals, senior staff and others use NAPLAN results to inform school planning and to allocate resources and support including informing decisions around targeted programs and initiatives for individuals and groups.

The best way you can assist your child is by helping them to feel comfortable about the nature and purpose of the tests, and assure them that the tests will give them an opportunity to show what they have learned in class.

Launceston Church Grammar School together with the University of Tasmania have been successful in gaining a grant to deliver a free "ICT Club" for students in Grades 5 & 6 from the local community.

The "ICT Club" will be held on Thursday afternoons, one session per term in the Human Interface Technology Laboratory, Australia (HIT Lab AU), at the UTAS Newnham Campus.

These ICT sessions will be run by UTAS staff, Dr. Rainer Wasinger and Dr. Winyu Chinthammit from the HIT Lab AU, School of Engineering & ICT, with the assistance of Launceston Grammar staff.

Students must be able to attend each session as a continuing project will be undertaken. Problem solving using ICT will be the broad aim of the sessions. The session dates are as follows:

Term 1 Thursday 26 March

Term 2 Thursday 18 June Term 3 Thursday 3 September Term 4 Thursday 19 November

Online RSVPs for the first session will open at 9.15am on Wednesday 18 March and the link to the website is www.lcgs.tas.edu.au/events . There is a limit on the number of students we can safely accommodate so it is important to register your child early to avoid disappointment.

When registering please ensure that you include your email address for future correspondence.

Sessions commence at 4.00pm and conclude at 5.30pm. Afternoon tea will be available from 3.45pm. We will have a register at each session where all participants will need to sign in and ensure that we have correct emergency contact details.

Attached is a map of UTAS indicating where the HIT Lab AU is located (noted as V, grid ref AS23). We will meet students outside of the building and direct them to afternoon tea. We ask that all students be escorted to this area by 3.45pm and collected from here at 5.30pm. Parking is available at the Unigym or The Walk Café (also noted on the attached map). These are voucher parking zones until 6.00pm, 70cents per hour. There is also a limited number of free 30 minute and 2 hour parking spots in these bays.

We like to take photos/videos of these sessions for our records and promotional purposes, please advise when registering your child whether or not you give authority for photographs/videos to be taken.

Students are not required to bring anything with them to the first session.

We will send reminder emails to participants before each session for Terms 2, 3 and 4.
