From the Principal:

Overland Jack Documentary:

Congratulations again to Rachel Williams and Damon Goody for their work in filming and producing the documentary. I really encourage as many parents and families in SHS to watch the documentary.

What is it specifically that you would celebrate and recognise about our catholic schools in Tasmania?

What is good, great and worthy of note?

What people in-particular this week should we recognise along with their impact on catholic education?

In a Mass attended by Grade 6 students from catholic schools in Launceston and representative students from St. Patrick's College, the Archbishop asked our students to do one small deed each day. Say a Hail Mary each day. Find time to devote 20 seconds at best to prayer.

Prayer appears to be a forgotten part of many of our lives. Everyday prayer I am talking about, not the prayer when you want something, there is serious illness of a loved one or you are really worried and stressed about something. A moment that you can find to be with your God. It doesn't have to be in the Church, it can be anywhere. The God I believe in, isn't precious if you are saying a prayer in the car, on the way to work, or in the bathroom. All that matters is that you want to pray and have a relationship in your faith.

We at home, not as regularly as we should, try to talk about 'God Moments' when having dinner of a night, where everyone shares those moments with each other. For me it is just as much about having everyone focus on the 'good bits' of the day not the ordinary ones. But it is also prayer!

As a school we need to improve, I think in providing a variety of prayer experiences to our students, even the prayer experiences our students may not naturally find as engaging as more popular options. Yes kids might prefer to find a song or youtube clip to then share as a prayer to start the day. Yes this is valid and important as it is important to them and their lives now. At the same time so is formal prayer, meditation, gratitude journals. What we want and what we need are not always the same thing. Being prayerful people is what is core to being catholic people.

From the Principal:

This week Simon Wood and Helen Halley were recognised along with other staff in catholic schools in the North, South and North West for 25 years of service to catholic education in Tasmania. Other S.H.S. staff in previous years have been recognised for their service and commitment. We are blessed to have people who are prepared to give of themselves personally as well as professionally in the formation of your children into adults.



Catholic Education Week is a celebration of our history and our future, people who have been of great service and those that will be in the future, of our children and young adults from Kinder to Year 12. It is all about what is right and working, not what is wrong and needing fixing.

Formation and Communication

Families who have applied for Kindergarten 2016 classes in Catholic Schools in Launceston have received letters of where they will be offered a place for next year. There has been some anxiety and nervousness in waiting for this. Families with students in Grade 7 at St. Patrick's are currently having to make decisions about subject and curriculum choices for Grade 8. There is already some thought about future career choice and what subjects might need to be considered.

Parenting a child starting school to parenting a child around subject choices in Grade 8 requires different approaches. If we don't change our approach then we can't support our children in the best way possible.

The same applies to schools. How we approach students and their needs in Kindergarten or Prep will vary from Grade 4 or even our upper primary classes.

At S.H.S. we are focused on supporting our children to be ready for High School. For us this means that from Grade 4 on we place more responsibility on the students to think carefully and reflect on their actions, to organise themselves more independently and just as importantly build trusting and open relationships with their parents about how school is going.

Parents who have experienced Year 7 and High School know the high levels of communication and engagement that our school offers compared to a High School setting. It is not a criticism, it is a reality of the different age of students and the different model that High School is. I have personally been reminded how important the relationship is between your child and you as a parent.

As a parent knowing what is actually happening in the school and how your child is coping will come down primarily to how open and trusting the relationship is with your child. You cannot get the same access and immediate access that you do in a primary school.

Our approach with students in Grade 4 onwards is to ask them to sometimes speak with home before we contact you. We may sometimes not contact parents about very small issues in these grades initially compared to what we would do in younger grades. The students at times need to be left to try and find solutions to situations a little longer than we would for students in younger grades. Parents cannot be there as easily for their children or in the same ways for their children, once they are in High School.

Whether we like it or not, we have to be what our students need and what they need us to be as they get older. It is harder for us to let go and we do not want parents to be less supportive or less engaged, however how this is done has to evolve and grow, as our children evolve and grow too.

From the Principal:

LIBRARY

As we started this year we haven't had a set timetable in place for the use of the library. We were expecting the building program to start sooner and with some other reasons left the visits more informally to teachers to organise. With our building program confirmed not to start this year we will have a more set timetable for accessing and using our library for the remainder of the year.

BIRTH - 4 PROGRAM

We have offered Kinder placements for 2016 and would like to provide the afternoon sessions for 3-4 year old children to support them in their transition into next year. Existing families it would be good if you could also start attending some of these sessions as it is a great chance to have your child get to know new children and families to the school next year.

DEFIBRILLATOR

The Defibrillator purchased by the P & F has arrived. We are in the process of registering and organising with St. John Ambulance training for up to 10 staff. We are choosing staff who are not on a class e.g. office staff, leadership staff and some ancillary staff.

How to apply for a WWCC and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working with children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWCC card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.




National Science Week


