From the Principal:

Last Thursday our School Captains in their own time spoke to prospective parents thinking about their child attending SHCS. The question I asked them to answer and share is 'Why are they proud to attend SHCS?' Below are edited extracts of what each School Captain wrote. I am proud of their responses because they are 'their' responses and the responses they believe in.

"Hi I am Sophie..... When I wake up each morning I can't wait to get to school... it is a place where I feel safe. Sacred Heart is a very friendly place, filled with many kind people. We have amazing, caring, talented staff...., our kids show respect to one another as well. One of the other things that I love about Sacred Heart is MJR. MJR is Making Jesus Real. It is a more modern way of explaining the gospel values, and teaching children to be better people. When everyone Makes Jesus Real our school is a very happy place, when you Make Jesus Real you are the spirit of Jesus.We, as students are offered a huge range such as the basketball tournament, Launceston competitions, school band, Friday sport, sport and inter school carnivals and many more....Each class teacher chooses some kids who have done something special over the week,the House captains choose one person who has been a walking God moment, they are also presented with a certificate, Sacred Heart is a great school where almost everyone has a positive attitude.

Hi, my name is Will Symons.... At Sacred Heart our students have a friendly atmosphere to learn and play. We are taught Make Jesus Real values to help us live out the gospel in a fun way. Our students have really embraced this and it is one of the things that makes us a great school.... We also all make sure each and every student is looked after, respected, and assisted in whatever their needs are. We strive to do these things here and it makes us a really friendly and supportive school.

In the past few years we have started using IT in the classroom a lot more than we used to. In 2013 my grade were the first in this school to get our own personal iPads. It was very successful and now every child in grades 3-6 has their own iPad for school purposes. This is very, very beneficial to us and our learning. We use different apps to help us in the classroom like Google Docs, Popplet, Google Classroom, and many more..... We also use apps like these with our younger students, and they love it. It is preparing us for the future in using IT too. What we do with our IT is very unique and it helps our students be the best they can be......We have an excellent way of teaching the Gospel in Make Jesus Real, and we are very technologically advanced in the way we teach and learn. For these reasons I believe you should enroll your child in Sacred Heart School....

We juggle learning the curriculum, getting outdoors, learning life skills and more importantly having fun. Some ways we have fun is by giving to others.

Mini Vinnie's is a charity group that is open to grade sixes here at Sacred Heart. Last year we donated money for a shelter box to send to refugee families, we raised this money by having a crazy hair day, cake stalls, a crazy sock day and much more. With the whole school helping us we can help those in our community, our country and even our world........

Our students can tell us what our School is about, stands for and what for them, is a priority in their learning and formation. We as educators, parents and teachers need to do a better job listening.

- Gift hampers for parents when they have a new baby.
- Providing a lunch for children each day the weeks that parent has chemotherapy treatment.

Sadly there are ongoing needs for families due to illness or the passing of loved ones, at the same time, moments of joy or excitement that still place a strain on the day to day organisation or co-ordination of our lives. The Skill of MYTERN – continued from last week (accidently left off)

Family Activity:

Discuss the meaning of the green and the red roads with your child/children. Ask them what road they are on at different times of every day, beginning to make them aware of what they are feeling. Also, try to monitor which roads you drive down as well.



How do you know what road you are on? A GPS is a tool that can tell you where you are and help guide you to where you want to go.

Perhaps you use a GPS in your car. You can use this to explain to your children how they have their own inbuilt GPS that tells them which road they are on in the MYTERN city of emotions (their current emotion).

Feeling good? Your GPS is saying that you are on a green Reapo road building your health and that you can drive down there as long as you want to.

Don't feel so good? Your GPS is telling you that you are on a red Buska road building your resilience.

Our next post will deal with the characters of PET and TEP, helping you to take control of your steering wheel.

WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLE REGISTRATION

Government legislation now requires all people working or volunteering with vulnerable people to be registered. It is an expectation placed on our schools that any person who is on an excursion, helping in the classroom, helping out with students getting changed after swimming, attending camps etc must have this registration.

If parents do not have registration or registration is pending you may not be able to volunteer and attend the excursion or school event. This is something that we do not want to have to do but as legislation and system policy we need to adhere to.

How to apply for a WWVP and Number

- 1. Complete the online application form www.justice.tas.gov.au/working_with_children
- 2. Print the "Application Receipt" which is generated when the application has been completed in full
- 3. Take the "Application Receipt" to a Service Tasmania shop, pay the fee (\$17.60) and have your 100 point check to confirm identity

Once your registration has been approved and you receive your WWVP card, please bring it to the school office so your name, registration number and expiry date can be recorded and verified.
